The Gospel Reading;

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John (John 2 1-11) Glory to you, O Lord

On the third day a wedding took place at Cana in Galilee. Jesus' mother was there, ² and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. ³ When the wine was gone, Jesus' mother said to him, "They have no more wine."

- 4 "Woman, [a] why do you involve me?" Jesus replied. "My hour has not yet come."
- ⁵ His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."
- ⁶ Nearby stood six stone water jars, the kind used by the Jews for ceremonial washing, each holding from twenty to thirty gallons.^[b]
- ⁷ Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water"; so they filled them to the brim.
- ⁸ Then he told them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the banquet."

They did so, ⁹ and the master of the banquet tasted the water that had been turned into wine. He did not realize where it had come from, though the servants who had drawn the water knew. Then he called the bridegroom aside ¹⁰ and said, "Everyone brings out the choice wine first and then the cheaper wine after the guests have had too much to drink; but you have saved the best till now." ¹¹ What Jesus did here in Cana of Galilee was the first of the signs through which he revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ

Reflection Martin: John never tells us too much or too little in his gospel, only what we need to know, so the fact that there were six water jars has to be significant. It is – six is one less than seven! Seven in the Bible signifies perfection, so John wants us to know that this celebration in Cana in Galilee was one stone jar short of a wedding feast and if you will, Jesus was the seventh stone jar. He is the one who makes communities whole. We struggle to do things well, but when Jesus is among us, he transforms us and all our efforts.

It doesn't surprise me that Jesus' first miracle was at a wedding feast. When there's a wedding, people forget their niggles and gripes and celebrate life and love. When people get married, the old life passes away and something new is born, something beautiful and full of hope and new possibilities. All weddings are special but occasionally David, Tracy and I take part in one that reminds us in a big way that love is stronger than death.

John saw Jesus as the wine at the wedding banquet: the new wine which was poured out when he died on the cross. The old wine was past its sell-by date; no longer any good for drinking. The new wine never stops flowing, in streams of love and forgiveness. It is flowing now, and it will continue to flow in his heavenly banquet to which we are all invited. All we have to do is accept his invitation.
