The Readings:

The First Reading is taken from Isaiah Chapter 58, beginning to read at the first verse (Isaiah 58 1-9)

"Shout it aloud, do not hold back. Raise your voice like a trumpet. Declare to my people their rebellion and to the descendants of Jacob their sins. ² For day after day they seek me out; they seem eager to know my ways, as if they were a nation that does what is right and has not forsaken the commands of its God.

They ask me for just decisions and seem eager for God to come near them. ³ 'Why have we fasted,' they say, 'and you have not seen it? Why have we humbled ourselves, and you have not noticed?'

"Yet on the day of your fasting, you do as you please and exploit all your workers. ⁴ Your fasting ends in quarreling and strife, and in striking each other with wicked fists. You cannot fast as you do today and expect your voice to be heard on high. ⁵ Is this the kind of fast I have chosen, only a day for people to humble themselves?

Is it only for bowing one's head like a reed and for lying in sackcloth and ashes? Is that what you call a fast, a day acceptable to the LORD? ⁶ "Is not this the kind of fasting I have chosen: to loose the chains of injustice and untie the cords of the yoke, to set the oppressed free and break every yoke?

⁷ Is it not to share your food with the hungry and to provide the poor wanderer with shelter when you see the naked, to clothe them, and not to turn away from your own flesh and blood? ⁸ Then your light will break forth like the dawn, and your healing will quickly appear; then your righteousness^[a] will go before you, and the glory of the LORD will be your rear guard. ⁹ Then you will call, and the LORD will answer; you will cry for help, and he will say: Here am I.

Reflection David: The people Isaiah is speaking to are at first sight a very religious community. They fast. They humble themselves bowing their heads and wear sackcloth and ashes. Day after day they seem eager to know God's ways and ask for God's help. But, and this really is a very big 'but', their supposedly religious and spiritual lives are not reflected in their behavior. They exploit workers, quarrel and fight. Not only that but they are criticized for what they are clearly not doing - sharing food with the hungry, providing clothes and shelter. Maybe this passage was in Jesus's mind when he told the story of the man beaten up, ignored by religious people and finally bandaged, clothed and provided with food and shelter by the Samaritan.

There is excellent work done by Grace Trust, Salvation Army, Women's Refuge and a long list beyond, so thousands of years later the need is still there and the church, religious people (whatever that may mean) and wider society are judged not on words, intentions and reports but on action. Do make a special effort to bring food items to both churches for us to put in the Grace Trust basket or drop by St Clement during the week and leave things at the back of church. There are a lot of requests for help and you can trust that they will make the best use of any gifts we pass on. The Creed: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead,

and the life of the world to come. Amen.
