The Gospel Reading:

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew (Matthew 18: 21-35) Glory to you, O Lord

Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?" Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times.[G]

"Therefore, the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. As he began the settlement, a man who owed him ten thousand bags of gold was brought to him. Since he was not able to pay, the master ordered that he and his wife and his children and all that he had be sold to repay the debt.

"At this the servant fell on his knees before him. 'Be patient with me,' he begged, 'and I will pay back everything.' The servant's master took pity on him, cancelled the debt and let him go. "But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred silver coins. He grabbed him and began to choke him. 'Pay back what you owe me!' he demanded.

"His fellow servant fell to his knees and begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay it back.' "But he refused. Instead, he went off and had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt. When the other servants saw what had happened, they were outraged and went and told their master everything that had happened.

"Then the master called the servant in. 'You wicked servant,' he said, 'I cancelled all that debt of yours because you begged me to. Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?' In anger his master handed him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed.

"This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother or sister from your heart."

This is the Gospel of the Lord **Praise to you, O Christ**

Reflection: David Can you remember going into a church and seeing the Ten Commandments inscribed on the walls. We don't have them displayed in St. Clement or St. Nicholas but I imagine that as congregations let their minds wander during sermons those simple words probably had more effect than even the most erudite preacher.

So imagine if before the Lord's Prayer we had a picture or a short account that brought to mind the challenge of this week's readings just before we said for the thousandth time 'Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us'

Maybe we could excuse our failure to mirror prayer with action because of the obscure word 'trespass' Modern versions include:

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Again a word, 'sin' which we rarely use so perhaps we might find the

Message Bible helpful 'Keep us forgiven with you and forgiving others'. A bit vague perhaps so alternatives include:

'Forgive us for doing wrong as we forgive others'

'Forgive us the wrongs we have done as we forgive others the wrongs done to us'

Or back on time we have the Middle English version which was spoken in England for about three hundred years from around 1150s in the early days of St. Clement's Church: very succinctly: 'Oure dettis and dettouris' A sense of our debts to God and what others owe us, which fits in well with the picture painted by Jesus in the parable. The wicked servant more than happy to ask for forgiveness from the master for the financial debts he owed but then hypocritically failing to pass on that generosity of spirit to people who owed him money.

What are the grudges, debts, sins we hold against others and fail to forgive and let us pause for thought and hopefully grant forgiveness as we pray we will be forgiven when we next say the prayer Jesus taught us.

The Creed: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Prayers of Intercession: We sit or kneel Lord in your mercy. Hear our prayer.

God of mercy, your love overwhelms us. You are always ready to forgive. May all who are truly sorry, receive the knowledge they are forgiven and know the strength to start again. Spend a little time praying for people who find it hard to forgive and for those who need to ask forgiveness.

God of mercy, you hold before us a model of justice tempered by mercy. We pray for our prisons and all who work and live in them. We pray for people who work to rehabilitate and to reconcile one with the other. Give them patient understanding.

God of mercy, you release us from a debt we can never repay. We pray for all out of their depth financially and exposed to the unscrupulous.

Spend time praying for our financial institutions and for those whose task it is to protect the money in their care and promote responsible lending.

God of mercy we pray for the people of Morocco and Libya whose lives have been turned upside down by earthquake and flood. We pray too for the people of Ukraine and for an end to war and a beginning of peace.

God of mercy we bring to you those whose lives are filled with the pain of ill-health and are weary with it all. Pour out your healing presence on all who suffer and struggle to cope. Spend time praying for people you know who are suffering.

God of mercy, whether we live or die we are yours. Hear us as we remember with love all who have died. Comfort all who mourn. Rooted and grounded in your love bring us all to share in the fullness of life with you.

Merciful Father, accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.
