The Gospel Reading Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John (John 12 20-33) **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Now there were some Greeks among those who went up to worship at the festival. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, with a request. "Sir," they said, "we would like to see Jesus." Philip went to tell Andrew; Andrew and Philip in turn told Jesus.

Jesus replied, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds. Anyone who loves their life will lose it, while anyone who hates their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant also will be. My Father will honour the one who serves me.

"Now my soul is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it was for this very reason I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name!"

Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and will glorify it again." The crowd that was there and heard it said it had thundered; others said an angel had spoken to him. Jesus said, "This voice was for your benefit, not mine. Now is the time for judgment on this world; now the prince of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up^[g] from the earth, will draw all people to myself." He said this to show the kind of death he was going to die.

This is the Gospel of the Lord **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Sermon: Martin: Jesus says: "when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw all people to myself". It's an odd expression. When (in the book of Numbers) the Israelites were dying from snakebites in the desert during their flight from Egypt, God commanded Moses to nail a bronze snake to a pole and lift it up so that anyone who looked upon it would live. Jesus would also bring life by being raised up on a cross. The cross is not an add-on to the Christian faith: it is the way to eternal life. The grain has to fall to the ground before it will produce seeds.

Seeing Jesus is not enough: we have to decide to follow him, and in order to follow him, we have to love him, and the Cross shows us the love of God. I pray that as we journey through Holy Week, we will resolve to follow Jesus knowing that the reconciling and renewing love of God will be at work in our lives. It's a love that Jeremiah foresaw in our first reading when he saw a time when God would put his law in people's minds and write it on their hearts.

As we gaze upon Jesus lifted up on the cross this Easter, I pray that we may come to realise the extent of God's love for us and that we may be transformed by it and, like Jesus, shine as a light in the darkness of our world.

The Creed: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

You come to meet us, O Lord, long before we search for you. May your Church be a precious gateway to encountering your presence and glory ... may we grow in faith and love and witness to your love in our lives.
