The Gospel Reading: Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John (John 6 1-21) **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Some time after this, Jesus crossed to the far shore of the Sea of Galilee (that is, the Sea of Tiberias), and a great crowd of people followed him because they saw the signs he had performed by healing the sick. Then Jesus went up on a mountainside and sat down with his disciples. The Jewish Passover Festival was near.

When Jesus looked up and saw a great crowd coming toward him, he said to Philip, "Where shall we buy bread for these people to eat?" He asked this only to test him, for he already had in mind what he was going to do.

Philip answered him, "It would take more than half a year's wages to buy enough bread for each one to have a bite!"

Another of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, spoke up, "Here is a boy with five small barley loaves and two small fish, but how far will they go among so many?"

Jesus said, "Have the people sit down." There was plenty of grass in that place, and they sat down (about five thousand men were there). Jesus then took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted. He did the same with the fish.

When they had all had enough to eat, he said to his disciples, "Gather the pieces that are left over. Let nothing be wasted." So they gathered them and filled twelve baskets with the pieces of the five barley loaves left over by those who had eaten.

After the people saw the sign Jesus performed, they began to say, "Surely this is the Prophet who is to come into the world." Jesus, knowing that they intended to come and make him king by force, withdrew again to a mountain by himself.

When evening came, his disciples went down to the lake, where they got into a boat and set off across the lake for Capernaum. By now it was dark, and Jesus had not yet joined them. A strong wind was blowing and the waters grew rough. When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus approaching the boat, walking on the water; and they were frightened. But he said to them, "It is I; don't be afraid." Then they were willing to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the shore where they were heading.

Sermon: David When governments consider how to allocate what are often dismissed as 'hand outs' they will frequently try to impose limits. Age or income are obvious factors. I was involved in the old parish welfare committee system. I doubt detailed minutes were kept but whether help was given was heavily influenced by opinions as much as a formula. In contrast the loaves and fishes are given out generously to everyone. No forms, no income limits, just have as much as you need - and more was left than they started with. It is a living parable of God's generosity. As we regularly pray 'forgive us our trespasses' let's remember the abundance of God's grace as we fulfill our part ' as we forgive those who trespass against us'. We no more deserve forgiveness than the hungry deserved to be fed. We are called to be part of God's generosity in how we forgive or give to others.

Parents and godparents come to the font.

Our Lord Jesus Christ has told us that to enter the kingdom of heaven we must be born again of water and the Spirit; and has given us baptism as the sign and seal of this new birth.

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling.

Parents and godparents the church receives these children with joy. Today we are trusting God for their growth in faith.

Will you pray for them and walk with them in the way of Christ and draw them by your example into the life and worship of Christ's Church. All: With the help of God, we will.

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore, I ask you the parents and godparents:

Do you turn to Christ? I turn to Christ
Do you repent of your sins? I repent of my Sins
Do you renounce evil? I renounce evil.

Prayer over the Water: Heavenly Father now sanctify this water that by the power of your Holy Spirit they may be cleansed from Sin and born again.

Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**
