The Gospel Reading: Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark (Mark 13: 1-8) **Glory to you, O Lord**

As Jesus was leaving the temple, one of his disciples said to him, "Look, Teacher! What massive stones! What magnificent buildings!" "Do you see all these great buildings?" replied Jesus. "Not one stone here will be left on another; every one will be thrown down."

As Jesus was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John and Andrew asked him privately, "Tell us, when will these things happen? And what will be the sign that they are all about to be fulfilled?"

Jesus said to them: "Watch out that no one deceives you. Many will come in my name, claiming, 'I am he,' and will deceive many. When you hear of wars and rumours of wars, do not be alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come. Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be earthquakes in various places, and famines. These are the beginning of birth pains.

This is the Gospel of the Lord **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Sermon. Tracy The lion's den, the writing on the wall, the fiery furnace; these are the stories that make exciting reading in the Book of Daniel. Our reading comes from the last chapter and it is here that we have reference to resurrection for the first time in the Old Testament, be it only for the Jewish nation. Daniel was exiled to Babylon as a young man. His life in Babylon was spent in positions of influence as he proved himself again and again to be a man of integrity who was eventually promoted to oversee those appointed as governors in Babylon. But not all wanted to follow Daniel's good example and looked for ways to bring him down a peg or two. What we learn from Daniel is that he remained faithful to the God of Israel and that he nurtured this relationship with regular times of communion. He prayed three times a day – which in itself got him into trouble – and out of it.

As we set aside time with the One who offers us loving presence every day we will build up provisions to help us through our lives and others. A little like the nurse who vaccinated me against flu the other week, teaching my immune system how to defend itself. As we wonder about the consequences of another four years of Trump in the White House and the air of unpredictability that surrounds him, it will be good to remind ourselves of the loving faithfulness of God – loving faithfulness that will never changes.

We might also remember and pray for our brothers and sisters who cannot openly profess their faith in Jesus because it will put their lives and their families at risk.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Pray for people living against the backdrop of death and destruction. May the still, small voice of peace, persevere in the heat of hate and greed.

Pray for people who are holding on to their faith in God despite huge pressures around them to reject their faith.

(Pray for the people of North Korea where owning a Bible can get them killed Iran, where becoming a Christian is illegal and Afghanistan, where the discovery of faith in Christ can be a death sentence.)

Pray for our Chief Minister and the team around him. For our deputies in this parish and for all who support us when we need help.

Pray for our families and friends and all in need.

Pray for people we know who have been bereaved and who are at the beginning of their journey without their loved one.
