The Gospel Reading Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke Glory to you, O Lord. (Luke 3 1-6)

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar—when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of Iturea and Traconitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene— during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the country around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. As it is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet:

Reflection: David My favourite window is the one on the South aisle where the font used to be before it was sensibly moved to nearer the centre of the church. The window depicts Jesus being baptized by John the Baptist.

The season of Advent is one of preparation and in this week's readings we have the picture of John clearing the road ahead of a king. In modern times pot holes are no doubt sorted before a president or royalty visit and potential trouble makers identified and often moved on to reduce distractions from the celebrations.

Spiritually we are in the season of preparing for Jesus. Strictly speaking the second coming of Jesus but for most of us preparing for Christmas is enough. Advent is a time to clear space in our lives, remove the obstructions and navigate through the busyness to catch a glimpse of the Christ Child just like the shepherds and the kings.

The Creed We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being

with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen
